Turning Flat Illustration Into 2D+

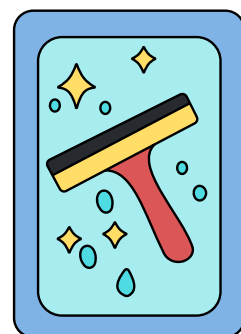

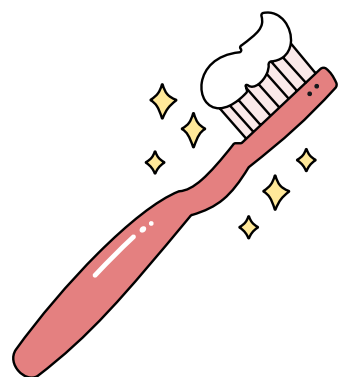
